**Purpose:**

This policy establishes the appropriate placement and characteristics of pedestrian crosswalk pavement markings and signage.

**Scope:**

This policy is applicable to all Department of Public Works personnel involved in the placement or removal of signs, signals, markings, or other traffic control devices used to regulate, warn, or guide traffic.

**Statement of Practice:**

The Department of Public Works adheres to the standards in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) and Illinois Supplement to the MUTCD (IMUTCD) regarding pedestrian crosswalk markings and signage.

In addition to the standard crosswalk markings and signage described in the MUTCD Department of Public Works staff will enhance crosswalk markings in the Central Business District and school crossing zones. These areas will display painted crosshatching or other approved enhancement in crosswalks in addition to the minimum standards described in the MUTCD.

**Implementation:**

The Director of Public Works, Assistant to the Director and Division Superintendents are responsible for promoting the objectives and goals of the Department of Public Works. Departmental practices and policies exist to guide employees toward achievement of both the Department of Public Works mission as well as the mission of the City of Highland Park.

All Department of Public Works policies, procedures, and practices are to serve as a supplement to the City of Highland Park regulations. If any conflict or inconsistency exists between language in this directive and any directive issued by the City of Highland Park, see Department of Public Works Administration for clarification.
